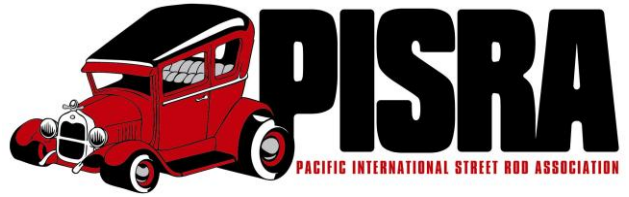

Minutes from April Meeting

MONTHLY MEETING MINUTES April 2026

Chairman Rob Petty welcomed everyone to the April meeting.

Membership: 62 members

1. **Previous Minutes**

Minutes from the previous meeting were distributed in the newsletter. Members confirmed receipt. No issues raised. Minutes accepted as circulated.

2. **Treasurer's Report** was made by Robert Bedard,

- Motion to accept Treasurer's Report: Moved by Tony, 2nd by Claire. Carried.

3. **Membership Report** • Current membership: 62 members.

- Roster has been drafted and emailed to members for review. Approximately six corrections received (wrong phone numbers, addresses). Final check underway; printed and digital copies will be distributed.

4. **Easter Run Report** (Tony)

- The Easter run encountered organizational challenges — cars split into multiple groups and some went in the wrong direction. • Turnout was much higher than expected; approximately 100 cars participated vs. the anticipated 25.



- The destination parking area worked well for a car show atmosphere — good for conversation and display. • Lesson learned: avoid city driving on Sundays, particularly holiday weekends with heavy church traffic.
- Full report with photos to appear in the next newsletter.

5. Hot Rod Reunion Update

- Planning is progressing well for the next Hot Rod Reunion. • Organizers are finalizing which vintage/historic vehicles will be featured on the poster and in the program (approx. 20-25 feature cars). • All registered attendees will receive a program as part of their entry package. • Seeking nominations for poster vehicles — call for members to submit interesting vintage cars. Poster artwork and promotional material being held until vehicle selection is finalized.

6. SVAVC Meeting Report

Insurance Warning — Collector Plates & Fleet Policies

Important information shared from the SVAVC meeting regarding collector plate fleet insurance: • Under fleet insurance, only the vehicle with the collector plate currently attached is insured. All other vehicles in storage are uninsured in the event of a fire or total loss.

- This issue came to light following a recent fire, where the majority of his 48 vehicles were uninsured because only one vehicle per policy carries the plate.
- Members with multiple collector vehicles are strongly advised to obtain separate storage insurance policies for vehicles not currently plated.
- ICBC is not proactively advising policy holders of this limitation. Private insurers such as Hagerty do not require appraisals and work with owners to agree on insured value.

Window Decals & Collector Plates

- Under the fine print of collector plate rules, commercial decals on vehicles are not permitted. Non-commercial club decals and rod run decals may be allowed but the rules are unclear. • One member noted their Model A application was initially rejected due to window decals, but was approved after submitting close-up photos confirming all decals were club/event related (non-commercial).
- The chair committed to seeking official clarification from ICBC on exactly what is and is not permitted.

General SVAVC Notes

- Attendance at the SVAVC meeting was approximately 30-40 people.
- Disappointment noted that several large Lower Mainland clubs (including the Road Men and Pharaohs) benefit from collector plate privileges but refuse to support the SVAVC that created them.

7. Old Business

55th Anniversary Run — T-Shirt

- T-shirt design is finalized, with James & Michelle Sandberg's 1955 Chevrolet at the pictured at the Glass House Winery.



Sponsors Hagerty and SoCal are included on the poster for donating.

- Front logo vote held at meeting: choice between blue and green version of the 55th anniversary logo. Members voted for the blue version.
- T-shirts will be ordered through PJ (Wendy C's contact). Starting quantity: 50 shirts minimum to manage risk; extras available as orders come in.
- Option discussed to offer front OR back logo placement — to be included as a choice on the registration form.

55th Anniversary Run — Registration & Online Payments

- Entry fee: \$35 (confirmed at prior executive meeting). Club member pricing and swag pricing to be finalized.
- Online registration will be set up by Sydney and the chair upon Sydney's return. PayPal will be used for pre-payment to reduce cash handling.
- Pre-printed car tags, tickets, and all materials will be ready ahead of time. Capacity is approximately 130 cars.
- Google Doc shared with executive attendees for collaborative planning — all edits welcome, please notify the team of changes made.
- 55th Anniversary Run — Swag • Options under consideration: 3D crests (\$15 each), coffee/beer mugs (\$12 each), min.36), etched wine bottles from Glass House (label already tested — looks great), etched glass beer steins.
- Etched beer steins to be explored — order only what is pre-sold via website to eliminate inventory risk.
- Brad H was meeting with Margita at Glass House to discuss wine bottle labels and donation of wine for run trophies.
- Decision: swag items to be listed on website for pre-order; items ordered only once quantities confirmed.

Dash Plaques • Hagerty is covering the cost of dash plaques. Quantity: 200 ordered (62 members plus expected registrants up to ~130 cars).

- Goodie bags (200 supplied by Hagerty) to include dash plaques, decals, club application forms, and Hagerty magazine & swag.

We Are Driven Decals

- Current oval decal stock has corner peeling issues. New designs created by Jason featuring the club car logo in various styles.
- Discussion on whether to update the decal design or solve the adhesion/peeling problem with the existing oval format. No final decision — to be revisited.

Oval Decals for Goodie Bags • If oval decals are produced for the run (every 5 years tradition), they may be included in goodie bags. Green color used for the 55th anniversary theme.

8. New Business - Swap Meet Banner –

- A 10-foot double-sided vinyl banner is proposed for the entrance sign at the fairgrounds swap meet location.
- Wording: Swap Meet / Cars / Parts / Collectibles (amended from original Cars & Parts; after member suggestion). Club logo in corners.
- Size: 10ft x 5ft preferred (\$585)



double-sided). Black background with white lettering selected over red lettering for visibility. • Date to be left blank with Velcro date attachment for reuse each year.

- Motion: Moved by Wendy Campbell, seconded by Dave Balshaw. Carried. Chairman Rob P to send revised proof to members before final print.

Golden Ears Swap Meet Update

- Golden Ears swap meet is under new management for their swap meet division and is now helping our club. • New fairground rules: no parking on grass, no vehicles inside buildings (must be dollied in), designated back parking area now used with golf cart shuttle. • Club was first to publish the Golden Ears event — swap meet Facebook page now at 2,412 followers; club page at 1,000 followers.

Upcoming Swap Meets — Promotion Needed • Mission Raceway swap meet: April 18th (first year). Volunteers needed to hand out run flyers.

- West Coast Swap Meet (Cloverdale): May 29-30. Chair unavailable — volunteer needed to hand out approximately 200 flyers. Entry fee ~\$14. Chair offered to cover entry for volunteers. • 5 swap meet registrations already received from Golden Ears handout.

Scholarship Program

- Two scholarships of \$500 each to be awarded (maintaining current level — not reducing to \$300). • Applications open. Recipients cannot apply two consecutive years; prior recipients given lower priority over first-time applicants. • Dave C remains responsible for scholarship administration.

Spring Tour

- Tentatively scheduled for May 3rd. Details to be published in the next newsletter.

The most important issue is to let Tony know whether or not you are attending as he makes reservations all over and we need to know if we are awaiting on anyone at the ferry...

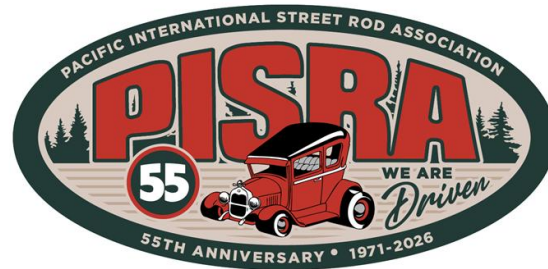
PISRA Scholarship 2026

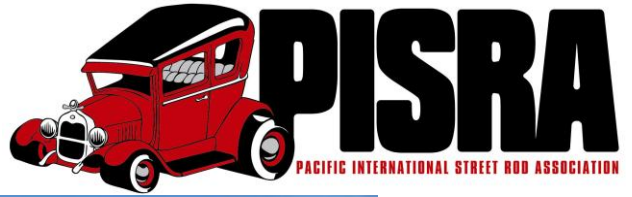


There were so many late 60's and early 70's muslce cars, it felt like being back in time...






Musician Jeff Beck – Hot Rod Builder across the pond...



The 1932 Five Window arrived at my work place early one morning. The consignee was Jeff Beck in Wadhurst East Sussex England. I helped with the paperwork to ship it to him. The car was from western Washington and had bene off the road for a few years. I remember sending Mr. Beck a fax asking if I could swap out my 20 louver hood for the 25 in this car. He said thanks, but NO I sat in the car for lunch that day, and knew I was in the right hobby... the year was 2005.



The only 2 tools you will ever need are WD-40 and Duct Tape. If it moves and it shouldn't, use the duct tape. If it doesn't move and it should, use the WD-40.



In the early days of hotrodding, Record Companies used local hotrods to entice more people to buy the albums. Everyone from the Beach Boys to the Ventures had cars on the cover. I have a couple dozen of these albums, and use the picture below as a guide on my phone. If you have the wall space, Michaels sells album frames for about \$22 for 3. 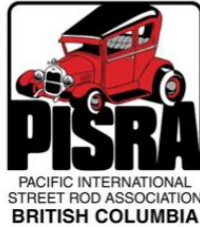
